4-H focuses on teaching life skills to young people through 4-H clubs and classes.

4-H Volunteers are needed:

- Advisory Committee: Meets 4 x per year, oversees and supports 4-H program. Committees include marketing, shooting sports, finance, special interest, volunteers, nominating and camp.
- Leaders: Work with a group of young people, parents and volunteers to run a 4-H club.
- Project Leaders: Teach about specific topics at 4-H meetings, using hands-on learning.
- Teachers: Teach specific programs for a set amount of time. We always need sewing teachers.
- Sewing Teachers: Help with instruction of sewing students.
- Embryology: Help set up and organize incubators other supplies, or learn to hatch eggs at home and deliver eggs to the classrooms, making short presentations to the children, or work on incubators or clamp lights.
- Marketing: Write articles, man 4-H tables at festivals, or speak about 4-H.
- Presentation Coaching: Help a young person develop a 4-H presentation.
- Presentation Judging: Use a specific rubric to judge a 4-H presentation, and offer constructive feedback.
- Help teach young people how to grow gardens in the 4-H Mini-Garden program.
- Help with a 4-H cooking program.

Young people are also very interested in volunteering!

- 4-H clubs, for ages 5 18, meet monthly for educational opportunities, including community service projects.
- Young people, ages 11 15, can volunteer to work with the goats at the Carl Sandburg Home, in the FRESH program, Flat Rocks' Exceptional Sandburg Helpers.
